

## BREATH OF LIFE: YOU, YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFT, AND THE CHURCH

"The Discipling Church" 1 Peter 2:1-3

#### Introduction

"Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes in *The Cost of Discipleship*, "The call goes forth, and is at once followed by the response of obedience. The response of the disciples is an act of obedience, not a confession of faith in Jesus."<sup>1</sup> Jesus calls and, because it is Jesus who is calling, people follow. "This response is a testimony to the absolute, direct, and unaccountable authority of Jesus."<sup>2</sup> People ran along behind Jesus and He poured His word into their lives! The discipling church seeks to pour the word of God into the lives of Christ followers.

**Lesson Thought**: Discipleship is adherence to Christ, so it follows that discipling churches call people to lifelong Christ-loyalty.

# I. Placing the Text in Our Context: 1 Peter 2:1-3

### A. A Quick Review: Teaching (*Didache*)

- 1. The church must always assign the highest priority to the ministry of teaching because it was central in the teaching of Jesus and the early church.
- 2. After Pentecost, the young church devoted itself to the teaching of the Apostles.

### B. Healthy Churches Grow with A Healthy Diet

- 1. Peter uses a number of images to describe the Christian life.
- 2. Churches "disciple" well when both aspects of the Christian life are emphasized. Here are several key elements to keep a church centered in a discipling ministry:
  - a. Conversion (1 Peter 1:21; cf. also worship; proclamation).
  - b. Rejection (2:1; "rid yourself of"; cf. Mark 7:21-22; Romans 1:29-31; 13:13; 1 Corinthians 5:10; teaching; fellowship). Vice lists were common in the ancient world and the New Testament.
  - c. Sanctification (2:2; "desire pure milk"; teaching; fellowship).
  - d. Dedication (2:3; "now that you have tasted = 1<sup>st</sup> class conditional; cf. Psalm 34:8). We are to exhibit a continuing appetite for spiritual food; teaching; fellowship)

## II. Discipling People for the Work of the Ministry

### A. Status of the Church

- 1. In Current Society
- 2. Different beliefs and attitudes shaped by non-Christian systems
- 3. Frustrated Proclamation
- 4. Reality We may grow numerically but be empty of spiritual life.

# **B.** Steps Toward True Equipping Disciples

- 1. Determine Needs
- 2. Become Missional
- 3. Seek to have a vital public witness (See II. A. 1.).

# **C. Geographic Teaching** (Teaching never only about edification – must be about evangelization)

- 1. Disciple members to reach people where they live and work (ministry; proclamation).
- 2. Sincerely obedient to his great commission (proclamation).
- 3. Unrestricted world focus in your local context (worship/Philippians 2:9-11).

## **D.** Possess a Contagious Experience

- 1. Share what we have been taught ourselves.
- 2. Draw others into the orbit of our own experience.
- 3. Expect new believers to reproduce immediately.
- 4. Flaw in discipleship classes evangelism is often muted (John 15:1-2, 8).
- 5. "Inward journey must be outward" (John 17:18).

# **III. Shifting Focus in Discipling Toward Mentoring Disciples**

### A. Origin of Mentoring

- 1. Greek mythology
- 2. Christian discipling
  - a. Give up one's will for that of Father's.
  - b. Live sacrificially each day for Christ's glory.
  - c. Strive to be obedient to Christ's commands.

### **B.** Mentor in general

- 1. One of superior rank in an organization.
- 2. Authority in his or her field as a result of disciplined work, study, and experience.
- 3. Has a certain measure of influence in his or her chosen field.
- 4. Genuinely interested in a protégés growth and development.
